Our Cambridge Kings Team, consisting of Lillie May - Rosemount Prince Danny, Kate Sullivan - Colour Miss Ireland and Polly Taylor – Cassieopia all rode well but on this occasion were unplaced.

We recently held our annual CDRC club camp at Milton Keynes Eventing Centre. Unfortunately, this event clashed with several other local events, including the BRC Area 7 Dressage Qualifier. This was a pity, as several of the members at camp would have competed in the Area Dressage.

# 20th April 2019 - Area 7 Horse Trials 2019, The College Equestrian Centre, Keysoe

The Area qualifier was held early this year at Keysoe on 20<sup>th</sup> April. We fielded Senior teams in all sections 80 90 100 & 100+ which was fantastic. The day was well organised by the Area 7 committee and thanks to all who helped on the day. Great results and congratulations to Coco Chambers who won the 80cm for her section and Philli Williams 1<sup>st</sup> in the 100+ and to the 100+ team who won and have qualified for the Horse Trials championships along with Polly Taylor who came 2<sup>nd</sup> in the 100. Congratulations also to Ella Crook 5<sup>th</sup> and Julie Horse 7<sup>th</sup> in the 80cm and Nuala Hemington 5<sup>th</sup> and Claire Elbrow 6<sup>th</sup> in the 90.

And as for our juniors, both teams in the 80 and 90 won the qualifier on April 20th at Keysoe and have qualified for the Horse Trials Championships at Swalcliffe in August: Fionn, Paige, Lille and Anna in the 80 and Erin, Eliza and Ruby in the 90. Jessica Cahn also took part as an individual in the 80HT.

#### Dressage

The senior team from Cambridge RC were very excited to be one of 25 teams from across the UK to have qualified for the dressage championships at Bury Farm in Buckinghamshire. Unfortunately Storm Hannah was also excited to arrive on the same day! Vicky travelled up the day before to stay overnight so that her horse would be well rested. Sadly neither Vicky or Rubin got any sleep that night with the high winds, and he was totally unable to settle in the arena in the morning.



My own horse Silver is not best keen on wind, however with the addition of an ear bonnet to keep the wind and rain out of his ears, which he hates, he was able to keep a lid on his enthusiasm to score 71.15% for 4<sup>th</sup> place, just missing out on the mounted presentation. I was very impressed with him when he didn't join in with another horse in the warmup which did buck its rider off. I could certainly sense that he was tempted!

With the afternoon's arrival the wind began to die down and the rain ceased. Philli Williams and Tango performed a polished test to score 72.38% for another 4<sup>th</sup> place, missing out on the mounted presentation just on lower collective marks. Last to go Rachel Casbon had carefully made her way to the venue towing Squirt in her trailer, not an easy journey when towing. Squirt,

being the pro he is, seemed completely unconcerned by the wind, and performed a neat test. I'm sure if he could talk he would tell Silver & Rubin "seriously mate, it's just wind!"

#### CDRC Autumn Seaside Weekend 2019

We have booked the Bunkhouse Barn at Courtyard Farm Ringstead for the weekend of 25-27 October 2019 if anyone would like to join us. See <u>www.courtyardfarm.com</u>

Lots of safe off road hacking available around the farm or longer routes to the beach at Holme or Ringstead Downs and Peddars Way. We normally arrive by lunchtime on Friday and ride in the afternoon with a longer day ride on Saturday then a shorter ride Sunday morning before we depart early afternoon. You can ride with us in groups or go off on your own.

There are bunk beds available in the bunkhouse barn (12 spaces) or you can sleep in lorries/caravans etc in the field. The horses can have a stable or grazing and you may need to bring electric fencing to section off the larger paddocks.

The last few years we have all brought some food to contribute to a 'bring and share' meal in the bunkhouse each night or you can go out to eat or get fish and chips from Hunstanton. There is a small kitchen and a dining area in the bunkhouse.
